## **CAVE AND KARST CONSERVATION**

In karst (limestone and marble) landscapes, water moves underground very quickly. The soil in such areas is often thin or nonexistent. As a result contaminants move to the water table quickly. Because caves are like natural pipes, pollution may then move many miles without any change. Thus, a spill may contaminate a spring several miles away.

Thousands of people visit NCC caves annually and an additional unknown number visit the preserves to walk the nature trails and otherwise enjoy the karst landscapes. All of our preserves were acquired with the help of conservation-minded individuals who volunteered to conduct fundraising events and navigate us through the acquisition process.

# NCC GEOGRAPHIC REGION

The NCC's region covers Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island and Vermont. While our current preserves are in New York, we have done management consulting and provided hands-on assistance in other states.
