Attachment A PRESIDENT'S REPORT 6/10/08

Merlins Cave, Columbia Co., NY
 Three important steps are underway: fund raising has begun, the Acquisitions Chair and myself are drafting a purchase contract, and our Treasurer has taken several important steps towards boosting our fund raising and launching into grant writing. The NCC is starting its largest acquisition to date and the movement towards fund raising via grants is a major leap forward for us.

Related issues include analysis of the winter bat survey and more local community involvement. The Acquisitions Committee is in the process of scheduling a public lecture with the Canaan Historical Society to talk about the discovery of Merlins, the cave itself and the NCC plans for it. This should result in good public relations and possible local assistance, both financial and other.

- 2. <u>Spring 08 NRO Auction</u>. WE announced that the proceeds of the auction would go towards Merlins and we raised over \$500 on the auction and an additional \$160 in donations. Other donations designated for Merlins have been and will continue to come in.
- 3. Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy Annual Banquet. On May 14, Christa Hay, Chuck Porter and I attended this and networked the crowd. MHLC is our "landlord" for Onesquethaw Cave and talking with their leaders can only have positive and long-reaching effects. For example, we have been recently asked by their president to give a presentation on caves in September.
- 4. <u>Carlisle Karst Tour.</u> Mike Chu and I led nearly 40 people on a driving tour of the caves and karst of the Town of Carlisle on June 1. It was sponsored by the Carlisle Historical Society and they once again expressed their appreciation of the NCC contribution of a sizable chapter in their bicentennial book on caves last year. Thanks to Chuck Porter and Jay Siemion for that! We stopped at McFails, Doc Shauls Resurgence, road stop at Barracks Zourie and ended at Sellecks.
 - From this tour the NCC has been invited on a hike up privately-owned Barracks Zourie in the near future, a view not to be missed! As always with these public gatherings, we get inquiries, sometimes cave leads and permission/invites, and interest in our program of cleaning up sinkholes.
- 5. <u>Clarksville Heritage Days, August 2.</u> Stop by and support the firemen's breakfast, car show, and later a chicken BBQ if you are caving in the area that day. Other events are planned and the NCC probably will have some presence (poster, surface tour?). We have again taken out an ad in their promotion booklet.
- 6. White Nose Syndrome. Peter Youngbaer has been extremely busy in the task of liaison for the cavers with the researchers and he has been assisted by Mike Warner. The continual updates and links on our website speak to their efforts.

2007 federal income tax returns were filed before the May 15th deadline. Copies were distributed to the Board.

Note that our funds invested with the National Speleological Foundation are down \$2,637 for the 1st quarter of 2008, following the trend of the market, though still up 8.35% year to year. Also note that the above figures do not include the most recent bank deposit that includes income from NRO. Including the 6/4 deposit gives the NCC total current assets of \$69,936.91.

Fundraising for Merlins Cave is moving along slowly. We currently have \$1,100 in the Merlins Cave Fund. On March 27th, Bob Addis, Chuck Porter and I attended a very fruitful meeting with Tom Crowell and Tony Colyer-Pendas of the Columbia Land Conservancy, which will be receiving the conservation easement from the NCC following the closing on the property. The CLC folks gave us several good leads on grant funding, as well as forwarded a motion to their board to decrease the costs of completing the easement. The portion the CLC voted to forgive may be used towards other matching grants totals.

In following up on some of the aforementioned grant funding sources, it was discovered that the NCC was not an officially recognized New York State Charity. I have submitted the necessary application and check for \$25, and we are now pending the state's approval. To apply for any state grants, including federal grants managed by the State of NY, we must have our Charity Bureau Registration number in hand.

I also did my share of networking with other local land conservancies recently, attending both the annual meeting of the Rondout Esopus Land Conservancy (they would take the easement on Pompeys if/when this purchase moves forward), as well as the Columbia Land Conservancy's annual bbq where I happened to meet the owners of Indian Oven Cave. Increasing our visibility with regional land conservancies is an important key to our future growth as an all-volunteer organization.
